"THE RULES OF THE POTTERY"

Text: Isaiah 64:8 "Yet, O Lord, you are our Father. We are the clay; you are the potter. We are all the work of your hand."

INTRODUCTION – On the first Sunday of a new Church Year, it is entirely appropriate to go over the basic rules that will govern the year ahead. Isaiah draws an analogy from a pottery and applies it to the church. He compares us to clay, and God, to the potter. In God's pottery, He sets the rules by which we live.

1 – Pottery 101: The Potter is the Boss.

- 2 All clay objects were created by the Potter.
- 3 Each clay object is an original.
- 4 Looks and function differ from one to another.
- 5 Changes are part of life in the pottery.
- 6 Dry clay will crack.

7 – Since we are God's creation – where is pride, supremacy?

CONCLUSION – A review of the rules our Lord God put in place for life in his world and especially in his family (those redeemed by Jesus through faith) is a humbling experience. None is above another and all are in the care of the Maker. Like clay, our Father in heaven molds us to his pleasure. We are privileged to be called the children of God! Amen.

FIRST SUNDAY IN ADVENT

The Lord Jesus Comes in Meekness and Humility to Save Us

Although we pray that God "would rend the heavens and come down" (Is. 64:1), that He would take vengeance against our enemies, we ourselves "have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a polluted garment" (Is. 64:6). We have continued in our sins for "a long time, and shall we be saved?" (Is. 64:5). Yet, the Lord does not punish us in anger. He comes in voluntary meekness and humility to save us by His grace. Just as He once came into Jerusalem to sacrifice Himself for us upon the cross (Mark 11:4–8), He still comes to His Church with the fruits of His Passion. By His ministry of the Gospel, we are "enriched in him in all speech and all knowledge," and so He will "sustain you to the end" (1 Cor. 1:5, 8). Although "heaven and earth will pass away," His words "will not pass away" (Mark 13:31). As He sends disciples to call us to Himself in the fellowship of His Church, so will He "send out the angels" to gather us and all of His elect "from the ends of the earth" to Himself in heaven forever (Mark 13:27).
