Extended Ministry Endowment Fund

In early 2005 our church formed a committee to actively establish and promote an Endowment Fund. This committee had a vision to grow the fund, and support organizations throughout the mission field, both locally and worldwide. Bylaws were written, policies were established, committee members attended training seminars and much progress was made. In 2007 our first grant in the amount of \$500 was paid to assist in rebuilding a church in Maine.

Now, nineteen years later we have been blessed with generous donors and have established one named fund within the Endowment Fund. The balance of the combined funds grew to \$809,000 this past year! We have measured success as being able to offer support to 91 various ministries with financial support amounting to \$274,560. All used to spread the Gospel through Mercy, Witness, Teaching and Missions. We are truly blessed as this fund is strengthened each year and thereby extends greater assistance each year.

Hope for the Homeless and Destitute

This fund began in 2015 and has been steadily growing. Twenty-four separate organizations have already received assistance and we continue to learn of additional organizations that are making a difference in our community. Our members and friends have been encouraged as they become acquainted with many organizations that extend the love of God through helping others in need. The intent of the fund is to help the homeless and destitute in Milwaukee and its contiguous counties. Differing from our Extended Ministry Endowment Fund, the beneficiaries of grants from this named fund may include Christian based organizations outside of the LCMS. Many doors have been opened for us as we reach out in God's love, to share financial assistance, hope and the Gospel of Christ with so many disadvantaged people. All grants are approved in accordance with church approved bylaws and policies of the endowment fund and administered by the voting directors for the Blessed Savior Lutheran Church Extended Ministry Endowment Fund, Inc.

A subcommittee exists to promote this fund and to research the various mission outreach services being offered to assist the homeless and destitute in our area. Please consider joining this committee or assisting with this effort. Contact John Koch, the committee chair with questions.



2024 General Fund Grants

A Place of Refuge, Milwaukee

\$2,500

A Place of Refuge is a Gospel-focused service reaching out to women with the love of Christ with both words and actions. This Recognized Service Organization (RSO) of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod is a network of volunteers who care for women facing crisis pregnancy in South Wisconsin. The volunteers operate a telephone helpline, receive women and sometimes children into their care and assist them in finding resources for their physical and emotional needs. They also share God's love for us through Jesus, locate a congregation to nurture them in the process, and share in the joy of each baby born. There is a full time house manager at the refuge house where women may come at any time during their pregnancy and stay for up to six months after their child's birth. While staying at Refuge House women must participate in schooling, working and/or volunteering.



The Refuge House is supported by donations from our LCMS churches, grants, individuals and income from the Blessed Again Resale Shop located at 76th and Hampton.

Acts 1:8 Ministry

\$3,000

Located in Green Bay, Wisconsin this group presented their program "Acts of Christian Kindness" along with "Water Wells" to our church members.

Founded in 2002 they have trained people in all 50 states along with 116 countries to evangelize through a simple, fun and non-threatening manner called *Christian Kindness*. This organization features outreach resources for individuals and groups to find ways to spread the Gospel message by showing the Love of God through small acts of kindness.



Another project they began was construction of water wells and towers in Africa. Diseases from dirty water kill more people each year than all forms of violence, including war. So far 175 water wells have been completed.

God's love along with clean, safe and convenient water changes and blesses lives!

Doxology

\$2,000

DOXOLOGY is an agency of the LCMS which offers an innovative program of advanced study retreats to strengthen pastors for the task of faithfully shepherding the souls entrusted to their care.



DOXOLOGY provides pastors with a unique study and renewal experience, rooted in the classic art of spiritual care and informed by the insights of contemporary Christian psychology. It also provides special training to serve both pastors, lay people and wives. The retreat training environment, grounded in Holy Scripture and the Lutheran Confessions, ensures that pastors will be emotionally and spiritually refreshed and equipped by their participation. The Center provides a safe environment for clergy to reflect on their own spiritual and emotional health and assists them to review and enhance their professional competencies and skills as servants of Christ and stewards of God's sacred mysteries.

DOXOLOGY strengthens pastors so they can more faithfully pastor others.

Historic Trinity Lutheran Church

\$2,000

This historic landmark in Milwaukee is the oldest Missouri Synod Lutheran Church in Wisconsin. It was founded by immigrants from Pomerania, Germany in 1847 and the current building was constructed in 1878. We are all familiar with the fire in 2017 which left the future of the church unknown. Through the work of the members, friends and the prayers of many, much of what had been destroyed has been rebuilt. A new worship area in the basement level is currently being used for their worship services.

On October 31, 2024 the church was able to utilize the sanctuary for the first time since the fire as the 2024 Reformation Service was conducted in the sanctuary. The complete restoration timeline of the church is still not determined as the remainder of the project cost is dependent on gifts and grants from donors. Latin American Missions***\$3,000***

To support the South Wisconsin Synod's connection, the Endowment Fund was asked to support the various missions of the LCMS in Latin America. LCMS Latin American Missions seeks to spread the Gospel, plant Lutheran Churches and show mercy across the region. Their missionaries and partner churches support 43 church plants, giving faithful witness in 14 countries. Missions include training pastors, translating theological books, journal articles and devotional materials. In addition, more than 100 women across Latin America are enrolled in the deaconess program, studying God's Word so as to be His hands of mercy alongside pastors and bringing the needy ones to His altar. Lutheran education is also paramount in Latin America with 155 schools in 10 countries.

Lutheran Counseling & Family Services***\$2,500***

LCFS began in 1896 to provide an alternative to overcrowded orphanages in Milwaukee County. During the 1950's and 60's they realized the need of counseling for emotional and behavioral concerns for boys 6-12. Shortly after they added counseling for unwed mothers and fathers. Mental and spiritual health was always the top priority. Over the years they continued to expand their services and locations. Thrift stores were opened to help support these services. Today they support 1/3 of their annual budget.

Today they have 10 satellite counseling offices in the state, two offices serving adoption needs, 18 schools partnering for in-school counseling including the LUMIN schools in our area.

Currently, in addition to the many faith-based resources on a wide variety of mental health issues they also offer:

- Training church, school and community business staffs to learn basic signs of mental illness, grief, suicidal tendencies and other concerns
- Providing staff and congregation members with assistance in making referrals for individual, family or child counseling for professional faith-based counseling services
- Crisis Response – To have LCFS staff present and available for immediate crisis support and follow-up care for the LCMS community and schools



LCMS Missionary Dr. Ross Shaver

Dr. Ross and Kris Shaver are missionaries in the Dominican Republic. As a church planter and theological educator at the Dominican Republic seminary, Ross works with mission churches, mentors future pastors and assists in the formation of congregational leadership in conjunction with Concordia the Reformer Seminary.

Along with financial support we are asked to assist this family with our prayers to give them comfort, strength and guidance as they transition to a new location, language and culture. We pray that God will allow them to share His love with everyone they meet.

Lutheran Church Charities

\$5,000

LCC has several main areas of focus: Disaster Response, Hearts of Mercy & Compassion, Human Care and K-9 Ministries. Their mission is the desire to BE THERE to share the Mercy, Compassion, Presence and Proclamation of Jesus Christ to those who are suffering and in need.



The LCC is an important partner in the effort of the Synod of Evangelical Lutheran Church in Ukraine who continues to persist in their vital humanitarian and gospel mission in Ukraine. The Blessed Savior Endowment Fund has supported them over the last several years specifically for this Ukraine effort. In past years we have also supported the K-9 Ministry. The trained K-9 dogs along with their handlers are a bridge for compassionate ministry, opening doors for conversation about faith and creating opportunities to share the Mercy, Compassion, Presence and Proclamation of Jesus Christ.

The decision for the 2024 grant was made directly to LCC for their greatest mission need. Their teams have been assisting victims of the hurricanes in North Carolina, the wildfires in California, along with serving many grieving victims. All the while they continue to train more volunteers. They have hundreds of volunteers that are trained to respond quickly, sometimes within 24 hours. In 2024 they were able to train 289 volunteers in disaster response and they completed 198 work sites in 10 states.

Lutheran World Missions-The Attic Workshop **\$2,000**

The Attic Workshop, a partner organization with Hales Corners Lutheran Church began operations in the attic at Hales Corners Lutheran Church in the 1950's. They began collecting medical supplies and equipment. Orphan Grain Train delivers these supplies to hospitals in the mission field.

Over the years they have added hygiene items, school supplies, children's clothing and diapers, linens and quilts. The items are collected for several organizations. Love a Child, Inc (Haiti) with their ministry to expectant mothers, babies and children. Lutheran Border Concerns Ministries (Mexico) provides the items donated to help children and families with school supplies, medical supplies and hygiene kits. And the Widow's Mite Mission (AZ) reaches out to the Navajo Nation with clothing, linens and diapers. Also over 1,000 Christmas Shoeboxes are delivered to many locations.

The majority of their items are picked up by Orphan Grain Train at no cost to The Attic. However, many boxes go to locations that Orphan Grain Train does not ship to and these shipping costs must be paid through donations to The Attic Workshop (last year this amounted to \$5,600). Our church is active in donating quilts and Christmas Shoeboxes. With this grant, we are also able to assist with shipping these items.

Lutherans for Life **\$2,000**



Lutherans For Life has, since 1979, upheld the value of life affirmed by the resurrected Christ. They educate congregations on life issues with a Gospel perspective, equipping Lutherans and their neighbors to be Gospel-motivated voices For Life.

Lutherans For Life also offers help, healing, and forgiveness for anyone who bears the burden of overwhelming guilt through a 24-hour Word of Hope hotline (888-217-8679). This free service is available to men, women, and youths for information, referrals, and Scripture-based spiritual care to address life issues such as surprise pregnancy, abortion recovery, suicide, doubting salvation, and physician-assisted suicide. Life Teams, Life Chapters, and Life Advocates are developed in congregations and communities—in collaboration with their volunteer relations team—to affirm life and participate in motivating others For Life through the Gospel. Lutherans For Life also serves youth through its Y4Life program! Specifically focused on helping high school and college youth become Gospel-motivated voices For Life, Y4Life offers a variety of educational resources, service projects, and interactive, in-person opportunities that teach youth how to uphold the lives of others. Lutherans For Life offers a wide variety of print and online resources—including our quarterly journal, LifeDate.

SOS Center***\$2,000***

The SOS Center is a non-profit social services agency that facilitates Christian care, educational instruction, after school programming & life skills activities for children and families in the Milwaukee community.

They are located at 4620 W. North Avenue and are open after school every day for:

- Homework assistance in Math & Reading.
- Provide devotional guidance and instruction
- Provide a snack and meal to fully round out the students' opportunities to learn.

They commit to provide an atmosphere of peace, discipline, compassion and love.

The outcome of this assistance is:

- To improve academic performance for each student.
- Learn about and how to use the Bible.
- Prepare for meals by praying, waiting patiently to be served and use these newfound faith-based skills in their daily lives.

2024 Hope for the Homeless and Destitute Grants

Blessings in a Backpack

\$1,000

This organization mobilizes communities to provide food for school-aged children who might otherwise go hungry. Blessings in a Backpack strives to ensure children do not go hungry on the weekends. Nationwide, during the 2021-2022 school year this organization provided 3.2 million bags of ready to eat food to children at 1,118 schools in 46 US states. This grant supported the Waukesha County mission which fed 3,600 children in 36 Waukesha schools this past year.

Mr. Bob's Under the Bridge

\$2,000

The mission of Mr. Bob's Under the Bridge is to provide basic necessities to homeless people and others who live in poverty in the Milwaukee area. One of their stops is at Kosciuszko Park on Saturday mornings, where volunteers distribute clothing and hygiene products to people in need. They also offer coffee, snacks, and conversation as they strive to foster a community of dignity, compassion and friendship.



Previous grants helped to fund a four-stall mobile shower trailer and vehicle to provide up to twenty-five hot showers a day to their homeless guests. They are in the process of adding another mobile shower trailer as they have expanded their mission to include Waukesha and Madison. This past year they moved from a church basement into a warehouse. This year's grant will help provide underclothing and hygiene kits.

Mr. Bob's organization is totally staffed by volunteers and relies 100% on private donations and grants.

Hope Center, Waukesha***\$1,000***

This will be our 5th year supporting the Hope Center. They offer a caring and welcoming environment helping tens of thousands of people over the years in Waukesha County. Some of their services include:

- **Clothing shop** has Volunteers to assist guests in selecting free clothing.
- **Outreach Meals** are served at the Hope Center as they partner with many to enable them to serve 100 people at each meal.
- **Day Center** operates from 8-4 to serve breakfast, lunch, job search assistance, medical/social assistance and media (books/TV/movies).
- **Green Power Garden** is cultivated spring into fall, provides vegetables for their meals, local food pantries and a volunteer opportunity for many.
- **Project Move** can assist people moving from shelters into housing.
- **Outreach Nurse** visits the center to offer blood pressure checks and assess other needs.

***Milwaukee Homeless Veterans Initiative******\$1,000***

Founded and run by veterans, MHVI's mission is to help homeless and at-risk veterans reach and maintain their highest levels of independence. They offer unique programs to fill the gaps and cooperate with the Veterans Administration, Wisconsin Department of Veterans Affairs, County Veterans Service Officers, and other non-profit agencies. Since 2008, they have served thousands of veterans and their families. Some of their programs consist of:

- Specialized programs for women veterans
- Home support for assisting to furnish basic needs when stable housing is secured
- Emergency food pantry
- Bikes for stripes-provides free, donated bicycles to homeless veterans, who often have no other form of transportation
- Crisis management with a focus on basic needs to ensure they have secure housing, medical care, clothing and food.



Repairers of the Breach***\$2,500***

This service organization is a non-profit, faith based entity located at 1335 W. Vliet Street in Milwaukee. They operate as an overnight shelter for eighty-five homeless adults. During the daytime hours they serve an average of one-hundred twenty guests. They serve a breakfast and lunch six days a week to poor individuals in the community, the majority are homeless. They also provide a warming room service where people are offered refuge overnight in extreme weather conditions. Other day services include a free on-site medical clinic, art therapy classes, literacy center, dedicated phone line, employment assistance, computer room, learning center, Bible studies, outreach to the VA medical staff and access to the Milwaukee Homeless Veterans Initiative.

***Street Angels, Inc.******\$2,000***

This grant has been provided to Street Angels to assist in maintaining their program to continue assisting our homeless population in downtown Milwaukee and the near south side of Milwaukee. We previously provided funds to help with the purchase of a second bus to expand their serving area.

Since 2016, the teams of Street Angels (a mobile outreach organization) volunteers travel directly to those who are experiencing homelessness in Milwaukee County to provide them with unwavering support. They aim to provide basic needs, advocacy, and hope through two mobile routes (156 nights per year), averaging 70-90 stops per night. They provide nourishment (a hot meal for the moment and a lunch for later), survival supplies, and hope. While the items offered are a vital need, most importantly, these items are used as a tool to build trust and open the lines of communication. Also, during cold weather they are able to transport people to shelters.



Every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday Street Angels Showers of Hope outreach provides access to a hot shower via their 3-stall, ADA compatible shower trailer. Guests are provided with clean clothing, towels, hygiene kits, a nutritious bag lunch, and a private hot shower.

Tippecanoe Presbyterian Church***\$500***

This church, located south of downtown Milwaukee, has a Divine Intervention program along with a warming room that is provided each season to the homeless population. They open their church hall from 6pm to 8am each day between December 1 and March 31. During extreme cold they remain open extra hours. Their program receives referrals from an organization through Milwaukee County social service agencies.

Meals are being provided by 9 different churches along with individual donors who prepare meals and snacks. After prayer, their guests are served a hot meal each evening. In the morning they are provided a breakfast before they leave. If guests are able to abide by the covenant established (this includes sobriety, drug free, and a cooperative spirit of respect for others), they are able to shelter throughout the winter at this church. Weekly, case managers visit the guests to stabilize their housing situation prior to the end of the season. Although they can accommodate 20 guests each night, they served 40 guests in 2023. The guests participate in chores such as; kitchen duty and shoveling snow. Church volunteers and a staff person serve as hosts each evening. They will also transport guest to a local laundromat on Sunday afternoons and provide them with coins and supplies.

This is all funded and run by their amazing volunteers and monetary donations.

Veterans Outreach of Wisconsin***\$2,000***

The mission of Veterans Outreach of Wisconsin (VOW) is to assist homeless and at-risk Veterans strive for normalcy in life by providing food, clothing, shelter, and other basic human needs. Based in Racine, WI, they work to make a difference in the lives of at-risk Veteran households in every community across Wisconsin.

In 2017 their program expanded to include a village of 15 tiny homes, a food market, and trauma-informed programming. When a resident no longer has to worry about their immediate needs, they can start building for the future. Veteran residents have the support to hope, plan, and dream for the next chapter of their lives. They also offer programs and services such as financial literacy. Veteran peer support groups, weekly wellness activities, job facilitation, and service hours helping the residents engage with the broader community.

The services are free to Veteran households.

White Stone Warrior***\$2,000***

Bob & Wendy Crouch, are the founders of White Stone Warriors, a nonprofit 501(c)(3) charitable organization focused on helping the homeless; those literally living on the streets.

Six years ago, they began making meals in their home and then drove into the city looking for those hungry and in need. Since then God has provided them with a warehouse and many others who assist with food and distribution, organize fundraisers, community-building events, and serve a hot meal and other items to those in need. Currently they serve hot meals at various park locations in Milwaukee, Waukesha and Madison.



Presently, they are fundraising for a new refrigerated van, with a goal of \$90,000. This is a vital piece of equipment for their mission. For more information or to support this project please visit their website at <https://whitestonewarriors.com/>.

They are a faith based, all volunteer organization, operating solely on donations.
